- 9. Project No. 15-02: Annual CIP Paving, Pavement Preservation, and Curb Contract Award of Bid
  - Four bids were received for the project. The low bid was submitted by Little Joe's Asphalt, Inc., of Bonner Springs, Kansas, in the amount of \$488,272.72.
  - Total funding for the project is \$578,000.00.
  - Due to the extremely favorable bid prices, staff recommends adding mill and overlay of Pebble Beach Drive to the contract, which would bring the total expenditure to an estimated \$563,000.00, well within the budgeted amount.
  - MOTION: To accept the bid of Little Joe's Asphalt, Inc., of Bonner Springs, Kansas, in the base amount of \$488,278.72, and to add the mill and overlay of Pebble Beach Drive to the contract.
- 10. Acceptance of Engineering Documents for Public Improvements within Gamble's Crossing Subdivision
  - Plans for public storm sewers and storm drainage for the development have been reviewed and approved by the Public Works Director and City Engineer.

**Consent Calendar:** Councilmember Buehler moved to approve the regular meeting minutes of April 16, 2015, and the special meeting minutes of April 23, 2015, April 24, 2015, April 27, 2015 and April 30, 2015. Councilmember Studnicka seconded the motion. The motion was approved, with Councilmember Trinkle abstaining from the vote.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

**Audience Participation:** Mayor Kirby called for audience participation and there was none. **Presentation: Citizens' Academy Graduation** – Five Lansing residents graduated from the fifth annual Lansing Citizens' Academy and were presented a plaque by Mayor Kirby.

Economic Development and CVB Director Stefanie Leif stated good evening Mr. Mayor and City Council members, tonight we are proud to announce that there are five Lansing citizens who are graduating from our 2014-2015 Citizens' Academy. This is the fifth year that we've offered this academy to our residents, we are happy to be able to offer this and all of our departments are happy to be involved in this as it's a great experience. Basically the idea is to have residents learn about responsibilities of all our City Departments, they also get to meet all the City staff members, and put a face with a name, and learn about different ways to volunteer with the community, as we do have a number of commissions and boards for them to serve on, provide more exposure to those for those who are interested in serving. We held sessions from September 2014 through April 2015, they were led by staff and often held in the department facilities, so they could also see where the staff worked and where they operated out of. Each session lasts about two hours, and then also at the end, each participant had the opportunity to evaluate the session and offer any comments to see if there is anything we can do to improve the experience for the graduates or do anything different for next year. Feedback from the participants was that they enjoyed the opportunity to learn about the City and different departments. They enjoyed meeting staff and developed a greater understanding of what the City does. We do recommend offering the program again next year and hope there is support for that, and at this time I'd like to announce the graduates: Michelle Avery, Teena Barber, Ronald Barry, James Fricke, and Janet Labbee.

Councilmember Pawlowski seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Condemnation Resolution No. B-1-15 (enabling action) for City Project 13-07 (7Mile Creek Action Plan Project): Councilmember Trinkle moved to enact Resolution No. B-1-15, a resolution of condemnation for permanent and temporary construction easements for Project No. 13-07, 7 Mile Creek Action Plan Project. Councilmember McNeill seconded the motion.

- Councilmember Buehler asked how many are we waiting on.
  - Wastewater Utility Director Tony Zell stated we have two properties left out of twenty-six.
    - Councilmember Buehler asked has everybody been agreeable.
      - Wastewater Utility Director Tony Zell stated everybody's been great to work with, we're just trying to button up the last few.
        - o Councilmember Buehler replied are you not able to get ahold of them.

- Wastewater Utility Director Tony Zell stated we are in ongoing negotiations with them.
- Councilmember Pawlowski asked is it the same property owner on both properties.





#### **ORDINANCE NO. 945**

AN ORINDANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF THE LANSING CITY CODE REGARDING ANIMAL CONTROL AND REGULATION IN REGARDS TO PIT BULL DOGS, WITH CERTAIN OMISSIONS, CHANGES AND ADDITIONS.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LANSING, KANSAS:

## Section 1. Omissions, Changes, Additions and Deletions to Chapter 2 of the Lansing City Code.

- 2-102 Definitions. Section C. Dangerous Animal, subsection 2, is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - 2. Any dog or cat having a disposition or propensity to attack or bite any person or animal without provocation. For the purposes of this chapter, where the official records of the Chief Animal Control Officer indicate a dog or cat has aggressively bitten any person or persons, it shall be prima facie evidence that said dog or cat is a dangerous animal.
    - A. Notwithstanding the definition of a dangerous animal above, no animal may be declared dangerous if any injury or damage is sustained by a person or animal who at the time such injury or damage was sustained, was teasing, tormenting, abusing or assaulting the dog or was committing or attempting to commit a crime, or if the animal was protecting or defending a human being or property within the immediate vicinity of the animal from an unjustified attack or assault.
- 2-102 Definitions. Section C. Dangerous Animal, subsection 3, is hereby deleted.
- 2-402 Exceptions: Permit and Registration Requirements, subsection E, is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - E) The keeping of a Dangerous Animal as defined in Section 2-102 (C)(2) herein or wolf-hybrids as defined in Section 2-102(C)(4) herein, provided that the following additional requirements are met for each such animal to be kept pursuant to this subsection:
    - 1) Each animal shall at all times be securely confined in one of the following manners:
      - a) Indoors, inside a residence or structure equipped with windows and doors that prevent the animal from exiting the structure on its own volition; or
      - b) Outdoors, in a securely enclosed and locked pen or kennel having: secure sides, which are either anchored to a secure floor or embedded at least two (2) feet into the

ground; a secure top attached to the sides; and access controlled by a keyed or combination lock. Said structure must comply with all City building and zoning regulations and must be adequately lighted and ventilated and kept in a clean and sanitary condition; or

- c) Outdoors, outside its kennel or pen but securely restrained with 1) a muzzling device sufficient to prevent the animal from biting persons or other animals, and 2) a leash no longer than four (4) feet in length. Said leash must at all times be under the physical control of a person and shall not be attached to inanimate objects such as trees, posts, buildings, etc.
- 2) The owner, keeper or harborer of an animal under this subsection shall display in a prominent place on their premises a sign easily readable by the public using the words "Beware of Dog." In addition, a similar sign shall be posted on the kennel or pen of such animal.
- 3) Each animal owned, kept or harbored pursuant to this subsection shall be registered with the City according to the requirements of Article 5 of this Chapter.
- The owner, keeper or harborer of an animal under this subsection shall, within ten (10) business days of receiving approval from the City for ownership of such animal, provide proof to the Chief of Police of public liability insurance in a single incident amount of \$300,000.00 for bodily injury to or death of any person or persons or for damage to property owned by any persons which may result from the ownership, keeping or maintenance of such animal. This shall require a special insurance rider. At the time of application for permit renewal, the owner, keeper or harborer must show proof of insurance for the present registration period and proof that there was insurance coverage throughout the period of the prior registration year.

In the event said liability insurance is canceled, lapsed, or for any other reason becomes non-enforceable, said owner, keeper, or harborer shall be in violation of the provisions of this ordinance and subject to the penalties provided herein.

- 5) The owner, keeper or harborer of an animal pursuant to this subsection shall, within ten (10) business days of receiving approval from the City for ownership of such animal, provide to the Chief of Police two color photographs of the registered animal clearly showing the color and approximate size of the animal.
- 6) The owner, keeper or harborer of an animal pursuant to this

subsection shall, within ten (10) days of the occurrence of any of the following events, report such event to the Chief of Police in writing:

- a) Death of the animal;
- b) Birth of offspring of the animal; or
- c) The new address of the animal owner should the owner move within the corporate City limits.

Any animal found to be the subject of a violation of any of the provisions of this subsection shall be subject to immediate seizure and impoundment and shall be delivered to a place of confinement, which may be with any organization which is authorized by law to accept, own, keep or harbor such animals. In addition, failure to comply will result in the revocation of the license for such animal and the permit providing for the keeping of such animal resulting in the immediate removal of the animal from the City, and may result in criminal penalties against the owner of such animal as provided for elsewhere in this Chapter.

**Section 2. Severability.** If any section, clause, sentence, or phrase of this ordinance is found to be unconstitutional or is otherwise held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect the validity of any remaining parts of this ordinance.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be effective on and after publication as provided by law.

SUBJECT: Authorization to Advertise for Bids - City Project 13-07 (7 Mile Creek Action

Plan)

The 7 Mile Creek Action Plan is ready to move into the bidding and construction phase. All regulatory approvals have been received, and staff and the City Engineer have approved the plans. This project includes the replacement and installation of approximately 12,000 feet of sanitary sewer.

As of the date of this memo, there are still two properties that need to be acquired, but staff feels that those will be signed within the next two weeks. This fact does not preclude the project from going to the bid phase. Given the proposed timeline below, there is still additional time to acquire easements prior to the notice to proceed date.

The projected timeline for the project is:

Advertise for Bids: May 22, 2015

• Bid Opening: June 17, 2015

Recommendation of Award: The week of June 22, 2015

• Council Award: July 2, 2015 City Council Meeting

Notice to Proceed:
 August 3, 2015

• Project Completion Date: January 29, 2016 or February 5, 2016

The project will be funded through the utility and a bond issue, at an estimated cost of between \$5.3 and \$5.8 Million dollars. Staff from the Finance Department will be available to discuss future funding scenarios that are under investigation at this time.

SUBJECT: Project No. 15-02: Annual CIP Paving, Pavement Preservation, and Curb

Contract - Award of Bid

Four bids were received for the project. The low bid was submitted by Little Joe's Asphalt, Inc., of Bonner Springs, Kansas, in the amount of \$488,278.72.

There is \$525,500 available for mill and overlay in Fund 70 (Tab 12) in the Street Contract line, \$15,500 available for sidewalk work in Fund 70 (Tab 12) in the sidewalk construction line, and \$37,000 available for curb replacement in fund 70 (Tab 12), bringing total funding for the project to \$578,000.

Due to the extremely favorable bid prices, staff recommends we add the mill and overlay of Pebble Beach Drive to the contract, which would bring total expenditure for the project to an estimated \$563,000, well within the budgeted amount.

Action: Staff recommends a motion to accept the bid of Little Joe's Asphalt, Inc., of Bonner Springs, Kansas, in the base bid amount of \$488,278.72, and to add the mill and overlay of Pebble Beach Drive to the contract.

# FACILITIES USE AGREEMENT GAMBLE'S CROSSING

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2015, by and between the City of Lansing, Kansas, a Municipal Corporation, hereinafter known as the "City" and Development Inc., hereinafter known as the "Developer," witnesseth that:

WHEREAS, the Developer has requested the City to permit the platting of a tract of land known as Gamble's Crossing, and further described as all of Lots 3 thru 8 Gamble's Replat, and part of Lot 1, Block 3, Gambles Third Addition to Lansing, all being in the City of Lansing, Leavenworth County, Kansas.

WHEREAS, the City has approved such platting as being in compliance with all requirements of the Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision Regulations in force by the City; and;

WHEREAS, the Developer agrees and enters into this contract to provide Public Improvements on said land which shall operate as a covenant running with the land and be binding upon the Developer and its representatives, vendors, grantees, assigns, successors, and trustees.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City and Developer, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein do mutually agree as follows:

A. Description of Public Improvements:

Public improvements consist of:

- 1. Storm Sewer: One hundred forty-five lineal feet (145 L.F.) of thirty-inch diameter pipe (HDPE, CMP, or RCP); two (2) 5'x5' area inlets with two throats; and associated grading for storm water drainage.
- B. Park Land Fees:

The park land fees in the amount of four thousand four hundred dollars (\$4,400) for Gamble's Crossing shall be paid prior to construction of public improvements.

C. Perimeter Street Fees:

By prior action of the City Council, perimeter street fees have been waived for Gamble's Crossing; consequently, no fee assessed.

D. Engineering Drawings:

Drawings shall be prepared in accordance with Paragraph 6 a, Article 7, of the Subdivision Regulations, and shall be submitted, reviewed, and approved before a construction permit will be issued for construction of the public improvements.

## E. Bonding:

The developer has elected to provide a performance bond in the form of a corporate surety bond in the amount of 125% (one hundred twenty-five percent) of the construction costs as based upon the actual construction contract amount provided by the Developer and verified as reasonable in the current market by the City Engineer. Once the improvements have been completed and found complete and acceptable by the Director of Public Works, a maintenance bond in the amount of 25% (twenty-five percent) of the construction costs shall be filed with the City Clerk, as a condition of acceptance of the improvements by the City. At that time the performance bond may be released. The maintenance bond will be in effect for a period of three years following the date of acceptance of the public improvements. At the end of the threeyear period of the maintenance bond, a subsequent inspection of the public improvements will be conducted prior to release of the maintenance bond. The maintenance bond will not be released until any latent deficiencies have been corrected, all lot boundary pins are set, and all sidewalks across vacant lots have been constructed. Performance Bond for these public improvements is calculated at a face amount of twenty-five thousand one hundred six dollars (\$25,106). Maintenance Bond for these public improvements is calculated at a face amount of five thousand twentyone dollars (\$5,021).

# F. Construction of Public Improvements:

All public improvements will be constructed in accordance with the Technical Specifications for Public and Private Improvement Projects of the City. No public improvement construction shall begin until all the below requirements have been met:

- This Facilities Use Agreement has been properly executed.
- 2. The engineering drawings have been approved by the City Council.
- 3. The required fees have been paid. NOTE: All fees to be paid at the Public Works Department Office.
- 4. The performance bond has been received and accepted.
- 5. A Notice of Intent has been approved by Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE).
- 6. A Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) has been approved by the Director of Public Works, and appropriate sediment/erosion control devices are in place.
- 7. A pre-construction conference has been held.

8. A five-day notice has been provided to the Director of Public Works before commencement of construction activities.

During construction of the public improvements and construction of the houses, the Developer will restrict all construction vehicles to the use of Ida Street. In no case will construction traffic be permitted to utilize access roads or parking lots of the adjacent commercial properties. All construction traffic will comply with the City's truck route ordinance.

### G. Inspection of Public Improvements:

- 1. Quality of construction of all elements of public improvements, including storm sewer and storm water drainage, is the responsibility of the Developer. Quality assurance inspections will be performed by the City of Lansing under the authority of the Director of Public Works. The Developer shall pay the City of Lansing a quality assurance inspection fee in the amount of 3% (three percent) of the construction costs for all public improvements as based upon the actual construction contract amount provided by the Developer and verified as reasonable in the current market by the City Engineer. Proof rolling with a fully loaded tandem dump truck will be conducted with the Director of Public Works or a designated representative observing the proof rolling process prior to the placement of curb and gutter and prior to the placement of asphalt. The Developer will keep the City informed as to what work is in progress, and will specifically notify the City prior to:
  - a. Placement of any storm drain collection and junction boxes.
  - b. Placement and backfilling of any storm sewer piping.
  - c. Seeding/sodding operations and seed/sod bed preparation.

A Storm System inspection fee for Gamble's Crossing is assessed in the amount of six hundred three dollars (\$603).

### H. Building Permits:

Building Permits will be issued when all of the following conditions have been met:

- The final plat has been filed at the Leavenworth County Courthouse.
- 2. Plans for storm sewer and storm water drainage have been approved by the Director of Public Works and City Engineer.
- 3. Water lines and fire hydrants are installed and operational.
- 4. All erosion control measures are in place.
- 5. The individual house building plans and site plans have been reviewed and approved and all building permit fees have been paid.

### I. Erosion Control:

Control of erosion and sedimentation during all phases of construction of the public improvements and post public improvement construction during the construction of homes within the subdivision remains the responsibility of the Developer until an occupancy permit is issued to the residential property owner. This work shall be accomplished in accordance with the engineering plans and an approved SWPPP. Additional controls may be required by the Director of Public Works upon his determination of need. Materials and installation must conform with the Lansing Technical Specifications, the SWPPP, and the construction plans.

Once construction has started on individual lots, the Developer will ensure that all builders construct erosion control protection for each individual lot, maintain such until the residence is completed and the ground cover is established throughout the entire yard, and immediately remove any soil or debris deposited in the street or gutters by vehicles or erosion.

Failure to maintain adequate erosion control will be reason to direct that work in progress be ceased until such protection measures have been properly installed or repaired, and full compliance with the SWPPP is reached.

### J. Occupancy Permits:

No occupancy permits will be issued to any homeowner in the development until all required work on the building structure has been completed, the building has passed final inspection by the City, and all public improvements have been accepted.

### K. Maintenance of Lots and Common Areas:

The Developer will be responsible for the maintenance of all lots in the subdivision until such time as an occupancy permit is issued to the individual homeowners for building lots. This will include:

- 1. Providing a suitable ground cover to prevent erosion, mowing of the ground cover, and control of weeds in the development.
- 2. Maintaining all building lots in such a manner as to eliminate the build-up of trash and construction debris.
- 3. Providing and maintaining appropriate erosion and sediment control measures in accordance with an approved SWPPP to prevent mud and trash from entering the public streets and storm sewers.

This agreement is not all-inclusive of the requirements of the City, nor does it relieve the Developer from the requirements not expressly identified in this agreement that are required by the Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations, Technical Specifications for Public and Private Improvements, and the Code of the City of Lansing.
