The regular meeting minutes for November 17, 2016, are enclosed for your review.

Call To Order:

The regular meeting of the Lansing City Council was called to order by Mayor Gene Kirby at 7:00 p.m.

Roll Call:

Mayor Gene Kirby called the roll and indicated which councilmembers were in attendance.

OLD BUSINESS:

Approval of Minutes: Councilmember Studnicka moved to approve the regular meeting minutes of November 3, 2016. Councilmember Buehler seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Audience Participation: Mayor Kirby called for audience participation and there was none.

Presentation: Lansing Visitor & Relocation Guide Photo Contest Winners: Mayor Kirby presented a plaque and gift card to each of the winners of the Lansing Visitors & Relocation Guide Photo Contest. The winner for the adult category was Elizabeth Perez and the winner for the youth category was Leilani Elena Bateman.

COUNCIL CONSIDERATION OF AGENDA ITEMS:

Unified Development Ordinance – Award of Bid: Councilmember Studnicka moved to authorize the City to enter into a professional services agreement with Gould Evans for the completion of the Unified Development Ordinance. Councilmember Trinkle seconded the motion.

- Councilmember McNeill stated I have a couple things, first would be that this bid is to do the ordinance for the
 comprehensive plan we did, correct, in part with the land use.
 - Community and Economic Development Director Stefanie Leif replied it is connected to that so when we did the comprehensive plan that is a standalone document, but there were several action items and suggestions in that ordinance about how to update our codes, change some zoning, and looking at adding some different zoning districts, and so part of that proposal that Gould Evans submitted to us does include looking at some of those areas and we do plan on working with the comprehensive plan suggestions.
 - Councilmember McNeill stated when Jim was here he gave a big speech trying to get us to approve the plan at the time, with the caveat that we would later get the chance to look at the areas that we still had dealings or contention with, and that's never been done to my knowledge.
- City Administrator Tim Vandall stated who gave the speech?
 - Councilmember Gardner replied Jim Pittman.
 - City Administrator Tim Vandall replied I am unaware of that. No one has brought up frustrations about the comprehensive plan to me.
- Councilmember Buehler stated there were a couple of areas in there, I agree with Tony, that we said we didn't
 agree with and Jim said I think we should pass it because it is better than what we have now, and then go
 back and address those issues, but we never went back and addressed them.
- Councilmember McNeill stated right, and that's what my concern is that we're going to hire someone to go in and write the zoning based on what was said in the comprehensive plan, and I know there are several areas that I totally disagreed and I was on one of the committees and said that wasn't the decision. If you look at the opinion documents that are in the comprehensive plan, that list, you'll see areas where it said final ideas that they would incorporate, a lot of the ideas from the residential or neighborhood ones there was nothing they incorporated, basically they just said final big ideas nothing, even though there was a lot of comments on do we want to remain a kind of bedroom community, do we want to build stuff, do we want buffers between residential and commercial, do we want areas to be apartment complexes, and a lot of people had contention with that, but it was really never brought forward from the committee into the plan. It was kind of like we'll come up with our own design and let you guy's kind of chew on it. We haven't actually been able to go back and look at some of those areas and determine whether or not that's what we agree with it.
 - Community and Economic Development Director Stefanie Leif stated a couple of answers to that, one is the planning commission has been reviewing the comprehensive plan, it is required by our statute to review the comprehensive plan each year, and the commission has been chipping away at that this year, they are not finished yet and I know there are a couple of commissioners that were aware of some elements they also had issues with and they are going to be looking at it again, so that is one thing that the planning commission is working on. But I think to your concern about is this really what we do end up wanting, we will have public comment opportunities, we'll have a variety of different

public outreach throughout this process, and so I think throughout that we'll be able to really revisit some of those questions and determine if this is really something we want in our community. I would like to mention Chris Brewster who is with Gould Evans is here tonight, so if there is anything, either specific or in general about the process they are planning to do, or how it has worked in other communities, feel free to ask him those questions as well.

- Councilmember Pawlowski stated I think piggybacking on what Tony and Gregg said, it seemed like at the time, and you weren't here for all of that.
 - Community and Economic Development Director Stefanie Leif replied it had been adopted before I started.
 - Councilmember Pawlowski stated there was a frustration among us and some of the community members that some of the things our groups agreed on, there were people on the steering committee that decided what they wanted and kind of ignored what everybody else wanted, and there were some frustrations with the entire process along that line too, and I know there were some frustrations with the contractor, because they felt like we should have just scraped it and started over, and I mean that's all stuff that's happened long ago and you can't do anything about, but I think that if there's a point where we can go back in and give them input; the guys on the planning commission were also on the comprehensive plan committee, Brian I know was for sure, so hopefully he's identified those areas.
 - Community and Economic Development Director Stefanie Leif replied there will be, definitely, as we're talking about either new zoning districts or re-vamping what we already have, or running some different design standards, looking at form base code. that will be part of the public process so we'll be able to look at those and make sure they are really meeting what we're wanting.
- Mayor Kirby asked would it be beneficial to have a joint meeting with them or just have Brian come in one night and kind of give us an update on where they're at.
 - o Community and Economic Development Director Stefanie Leif stated on the comprehensive plan, yeah, we can definitely do that. We can do a joint meeting, that might be really the best idea to have a joint meeting with the planning commission, and we can try to do that maybe early next year.
 - Councilmember Gardner stated not so much the comprehensive plan, but the issues that were brought up.
 - Councilmember McNeill stated there is a list and it's in the minutes I believe from the meeting that Jim listed an entire list of things that he said still need a lot of work, but he recommended that we approve the plan for now and then go back later and make adjustments. What I don't want to happen is they'll overlay the ordinance thing on top of that without any of the adjustments. If you're telling me we're going to have an opportunity to do that while still voting in favor of letting this bid, I'm okay with it, I want to make sure I'm on record saying I don't currently agree with the comprehensive plan as it was.
 - Community and Economic Development Director Stefanie Leif stated that's good that you're making that comment now at the very beginning of the process so we can be aware of that throughout.
- Mayor Kirby asked so we can make that happen. You can get with Brian?
 - Community and Economic Development Director Stefanie Leif replied yeah absolutely. The comprehensive plan is a guiding document and this ordinance is our regulatory legal document, so even if there is something in the comprehensive plan that isn't quite exactly what we want, as long as we have it covered in this legal document the way we want it, then that's really going to take precedent when we're reviewing projects.
- Mayor Kirby asked is everybody good with that.
 - Councilmember Gardner asked you okay with that Tony, Gregg?
 - Councilmember Buehler stated I'm okay with at as long as we have a chance to review it. Now you said we'll have a chance for public review, will we be able to look at it before the public review? I mean if we sit down with Brian and some of the planning commission guys and go through it and give them guidance as they write it?
 - Community and Economic Development Director Stefanie Leif replied there will be, I don't know if Chris wants to talk about what's going on and how that works with bringing the council in for this project.
- Chris Brewster of Gould Evans stated thank you for having us and thank you for selecting us. Typically when we go through this, as Stefanie said, first we don't go codify whatever is in your plan if there is a loose fit between the plan and the regulations, so we look at it as enabling tools to implement a lot of different decisions need to be made between the plan and the regulations. What we really strive to do is set up a code and structure that makes a lot of sense for you all, and it can actually survive subsequent plan amendments,

so it's not just immediately tied to the plan, so we definitely understand your concern and it's actually not unusual, we run into that a lot on projects when things are kind of continually revisited. To the process of when you all would be involved, what we typically do is we will do an analysis phase, where we look at, from the outsiders opinion, that's what you're hiring us for, we look at if there's mismatches between your current regulations and the plan, and there is a first input from you all and we'll typically have either, we haven't done this scope yet, but we would have a steering committee or stakeholder meeting and we produce a report that you all can review and where we think the fixes are. From there we go into a sort of discussion phase where we pick the biggest issues and try to look at different strategies on how we implement the plan. So some of those things that are on your list might be some of those issues and there's another level of involvement, and that's before we've even drafted anything for the solutions. So from there we do an initial draft and final draft where there is another round of input, and then what we typically like to do, and I think this gets more directly to your question, we don't want when you all have to adopt this, we don't want when you're asked to adopt this, that this is the first time you're seeing it, there should be no surprises by that point, so a lot of times when we get to the final draft we'll have a joint work session with the planning commission and Council and we can kind of cover the big themes, we wouldn't go through it word for word for everything that's changing, but we'll produce a memo on some of the more significant changes or things that were in your plan that the code didn't necessarily enable that we're trying to change and we'll cover those with you in that setting, so when you do get into the formal adoption you kind of know it well and we get better input from you all at that point as well.

- City Attorney Gregory Robinson asked could you address his question because I think I was here for parts of the discussion I just want to make sure what you're discussing is what he is asking because the plan may say this is for industrial or its commercial or its R-4 areas in the current plan right now. when you write the UDO will it be consistent with the document that's before and valid for the City right now, or will any of your changes to the UDO, or at least this new UDO, conflict with that current document, because what I'm hearing him say is that they're not necessarily in 100% agreement with the plan right now, so if you write a UDO that's either going to be in conflict with that or you're going to write a UDO that follows that, which he's indicating he's not necessarily in agreement with 100%. If you could just address that issue I think that might clarify.
 - Chris Brewster of Gould Evans replied sure, when we do these projects we're usually amending the ordinance and the districts, usually not the zoning map. So you have a zoning map in your community and we may be changing standards within all those districts but what we don't do, we don't go out and look at your comp plan and amend your zoning map to match that, we don't do that. Those are usually project by project decisions, so to the extent you disagree with any of those designations within your land use map, all we would be doing would be affecting the districts that would implement that at a future date, so it's built to withstand changes, and at a later date if you change that land use map, as Stefanie said, that's just a guide for when you come to that point in the future to make that land use change on your zoning map that wouldn't be part of our project here, none of those changes would be made.

The motion was unanimously approved.

Equipment Replacement Requests: Councilmember Buehler moved to authorize the lease purchase of up to \$119,000.00 of replacement equipment. Councilmember Gardner seconded the motion.

- Councilmember Studnicka asked is it in the budget and is the equipment we are replacing on the equipment replacement list, and this money is part of our budget right.
 - City Administrator Tim Vandall replied yes, kind of the way Beth had formatted it, we'd enter into a lease purchase around \$120,000.00 or \$125,000.00 for three consecutive years and on the fourth year the next one drops off and we would enter into another on and so on and so forth, so this is budgeted for. One thing I want to give a shout out for, if you guys remember last year's I think we had twelve or thirteen different requests, so I'm really proud of the staff for kind of scaling back and being a little bit more realistic this year with our requests. The four recommendations total amount is \$119,000.00, and one other thing I had a question about earlier too, just to clarify this doesn't mean we're going out and buying them tomorrow, this just kind of gives the department head the green light to go out there and secure bids and things like that, so the things that are over \$15,000.00 will have to come to you guys anyways. If something comes in at \$8,000.00 or \$9,000.00 and you guys are ok with that, I can approve that internally but anything over \$15,000.00, that's you guys.
- Councilmember Garvey asked why does the agenda page say the total cost of the requested items is \$183,000.00.
 - Councilmember McNeill stated that was for all the requested items, but he approved the four.
 - City Administrator Tim Vandall replied yeah, sorry about that I should have been more clear with that.

SUBJECT: Presentation of National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Community Rating System

(CRS) Plaque

Background: For many years, the city of Lansing has participated in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Community Rating System (CRS). Each year, the city provides public information, education, assistance, implementation, and enforcement of floodplain regulations. The CRS program measures a community's effectiveness at outreach and enforcement, and it ranks communities from class one (1) to class ten (10) with one (1) being the best rating. The activities are time intensive and many are quite complex, and they are performed on an annual basis to ensure the community is educated and more resilient to flood impacts. Each year the NFIP evaluates the activities to ensure that the rating can be kept by the community, and every five (5) years NFIP will verify the community's program and rating.

The city of Lansing has been rated a class eight (8) for several years, and this year we are very pleased to earn a higher rating of class seven (7). Former and current public works employees, particularly John Young, Dennis Thompson, and Cindy Tripp, were instrumental in the CRS program, and they worked hard to achieve a higher rating during the CRS verification process in 2015-16. This year the city will be rated a class seven (7), which increases the property owner floodplain insurance discount from 10% to 15%.

Sara Henry, the NFIP Specialist for Kansas for Region VII, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will be present at the December 1, 2016, City Council meeting to award CRS plaque to the community and recognize Lansing's participation and rating increase.

Financial Considerations: The CRS program scores communities from one through ten with one being the best rating. Lansing was previously rated a class eight and property owners received a 10% discount off of flood insurance. With the increase to a class seven rating, property owners now receive a 15% discount off of flood insurance.

Dear Mayor Kirby:

Congratulations! The Department of Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), Federal Insurance and Mitigation Administration (FIMA), has determined that your community will increase to a Class 7 in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Community Rating System (CRS).

The floodplain management activities implemented by your community qualifies it for a 15 percent discount of the premium cost of flood insurance for NFIP policies issued or renewed in Special Flood Hazard Areas on or after October 1, 2016. This increase in CRS class is based on a field verification of your 5-year cycle CRS application. I am enclosing the field verification report showing the results of your application review for your records.

Please note that Preferred Risk Policies, applicable in Zones B, C, and X on your community's NFIP Flood Insurance Rate Map, are not eligible for the CRS discount. Standard rated flood insurance policies in Zones B, C, X, D, AR, and A99 are limited to a CRS discount of 10 percent in CRS Class 1–6 communities and 5 percent in CRS Class 7–9 communities. The rates for these zones already reflect significant premium reductions.

If your community does not change its floodplain management practices, the CRS rating for your community will automatically be renewed annually and a notification letter will not be sent to your community. This renewal will occur as long as your community continues to implement the CRS activities you certify each October. If no additional modifications or new CRS activities are added, the next verification visit for your community will be in accordance with its established 5-year cycle. FEMA will periodically send the NFIP/CRS Update newsletter and other notices to your CRS Coordinator.

I commend you on your community's actions and your determination to lead your community to be more disaster resistant. This commitment enhances public safety, protects property, preserves the natural functions of floodplains, and reduces flood insurance premiums.

A total of 2184 credit points are verified. The community has a Building Code Effectiveness Grading Schedule (BCEGS) Classification of 9/9 that does not meet the Class 6 prerequisite; therefore, it is recommended that the community improve from a CRS Class 8 to a CRS Class 7. The following is a summary of our findings with the total CRS credit points for each activity listed in parenthesis:

<u>Activity 310 – Elevation Certificates:</u> The Public Works Department maintains elevation certificates for new and substantially improved buildings. Copies of elevation certificates are made available upon request. (38 points)

<u>Activity 320 – Map Information Service:</u> Credit is provided for furnishing inquirers with basic flood zone information from the community's latest Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM). Credit is also provided for the community furnishing additional FIRM information and flood depth data. The service is publicized annually and records are maintained. (70 points)

<u>Activity 330 – Outreach Projects:</u> Credit is provided for informational outreach projects that include floodplain information and flood insurance brochures general outreach projects that include a newsletter and participation at the spring and fall Lansing Daze Festival, and targeted outreach projects that include the community floodplain brochure that is mailed to those in the SFHA. These projects are disseminated annually. (118 points)

Activity 350 – Flood Protection Information: Documents relating to floodplain management are available in the reference section of the City of Lansing Public Library. Credit is also provided for floodplain information displayed on the community's website. (37 points)

<u>Activity 360 – Flood Protection Assistance:</u> Credit is provided for offering one-on-one advice regarding property protection and making site visits before providing advice. (55 points)

<u>Activity 370 – Flood Insurance Promotion:</u> Credit is provided providing technical advice regarding flood insurance. (15 points)

<u>Activity 410 – Floodplain Mapping</u>: Credit is provided for a cooperating technical partnership agreement with FEMA. (11 points)

<u>Activity 420 – Open Space Preservation:</u> Credit is provided for preserving approximately 72 percent of the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) as open space. (1096 points)

<u>Activity 430 – Higher Regulatory Standards:</u> Credit is provided for enforcing regulations that require development limitations, freeboard for new and substantial improvement construction, foundation protection, cumulative substantial improvement, lower substantial improvement, and protection of critical facilities. Credit is also provided for other higher standards, state mandated regulatory standards, and regulations administration. (365 points)

<u>Activity 440 – Flood Data Maintenance:</u> Credit is provided for maintaining and using digitized maps in the day to day management of the floodplain. Credit is also provided for maintaining copies of all previous FIRMs and Flood Insurance Study Reports. (123 points)

<u>Activity 450 – Stormwater Management:</u> The community enforces regulations for soil and erosion control. (11 points)

<u>Section 502 - Repetitive Loss Category:</u> The City of Lansing, KS is a Category A community for CRS purposes and no action is required. (No credit points are applicable to this section)

Activity 510 – Floodplain Management Planning: Credit is provided for the adoption and implementation of the Region L Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan, adopted June 5, 2014. A progress report must be submitted on an annual basis. An update to the credited plan will be due by October 1, 2019. (200 points)

Activity 630 - Dams: Credit is provided for a State Dam Safety Program. (45 points)

Activity 710 – County Growth Adjustment: All credit in the 400 series is multiplied by the growth rate of the county to account for growth pressures. The growth rate for Leavenworth County is 1.05.

Dear Mayor Kirby,

Congratulations to the City of Lansing on being approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for a class level increase under the Community Rating System (CRS). Your community will improve from class 8 to class 7. This makes Lansing one of the top rated communities in the entire State of Kansas when it comes to floodplain management.

The Community Rating System or CRS rewards communities for excellence in floodplain management with discounted flood insurance premiums. The insurance discount for properties in the high risk flood zones was 10%. Because of good work done by your staff the amount of the discount will become 15%. It is not every day that we get to tell our citizens that because of extra work that the City's staff took on the citizens are going to save money.

The City of Lansing's official new CRS classification became effective as of October 1, 2016 in the Flood Insurance Manual. I know that people from the Federal Emergency Management Agency have contacted your staff about visiting Lansing to award a plaque to your community. Hope that you will share this letter with the other members of your City Council when you receive your plaque.

FEMA does not require communities to join the Community Rating System. Your staff took on this extra work and responsibility voluntarily. There are only 32 communities in all of Kansas that are currently enrolled in the CRS program. That makes City of Lansing a leader in floodplain management in Kansas. Of those 32 communities many are at class 9 or class 8 without as high a rating as Lansing.

Much of the work that was done in Lansing involved outreach and education. The citizens, lenders, realtors and insurance agents of Lansing will be better educated about flood risk, flood insurance and flood mapping. Some of the CRS activities your staff has performed will make the City of Lansing more resilient in the event of a disaster.

The CRS program is a winning situation for everyone. The citizens win because they save money with discounted flood insurance and are provided with information about flood risk. You all live in a safer and better prepared community. The governing body gains the political good will of having done good work that saves the citizens money. The City staff can use the CRS rating to compare themselves to other communities in Kansas.

There are only three people who aren't coming out ahead in all of this. Those are the people who took on the additional work for the CRS upgrade. Most of the work that went in to the application to FEMA was done by

Cindy Tripp, Dennis Thompson, Stefanie Leif and John Young. The City of Lansing would not even be in the CRS program at all if it had not been for direction and leadership from John Young. Though John is no longer there to work for City of Lansing his work continues to help you all.







Court Service Contract

Included on the agenda is the Court Services Contract with the City of Leavenworth. This contract lays out the duties of the City of Leavenworth and their employees and compensation from the City of Lansing. These duties were previously performed by Leavenworth County, but the program is now being overseen by the City of Leavenworth. The contract is identical as last year's contract.

Budget Considerations: The amount listed in the contract is \$26,927. This would come from the Municipal Court fund, within the General Fund, line item 010-012-41143. At this amount, services would come in under budget.

Policy Considerations: The contract has been reviewed by Finance Director Beth Sanford and City Attorney Greg Robinson, ESQ. The City would not be able to oversee court and probation services internally, so the four cities in the County work together to provide a cost effective service.

Action: Approval of the Court Service Contract, as presented.



COURT SERVICE CONTRACT THE CITY OF LEAVENWORTH AND CITY OF LANSING

This agreement provides that the City of Leavenworth, shall provide the following Court Services for the Municipal Court of Lansing during the period from Dec 15, 2016 through December 31, 2017

- 1. Pretrial recognizance and Diversion Investigation Reports.
- 2. Presentence and Preparole Investigation Reports.
- 3. Revocation reports where indicated.
- 4. Jail release programs, including the working off of fines, and restitution, where appropriate, as well as straight work release programs.
- 5. Alcohol prevention and education and interaction in alcohol abuse of persons who are alcoholics or in danger of so becoming.
- 6. Follow up on supervision and monitoring of all cases assigned by the Judge of the Lansing Municipal Court, as the result of any of the aforementioned programs.
- 7. Obtain and do a brief write up for all court required offenses and make recommendations to the Judge.
- 8. Obtain all drivers license records for all major traffic violations and check for prior offenses and make recommendations for the court.
- 9. Prepare commitment forms for individuals sentenced in court.

In carrying out the aforementioned functions, the Court Services Office will provide correctional counseling and/or referral of offenders to appropriate supporting resources. These will include, but are not limited to: continuation of a monthly Alcohol Information School, other alcohol treatment programs, both inpatient and outpatient, employment and educational support, mental health diagnostic evaluation and treatment programs, both inpatient and outpatient and any other supporting program available.

In return for the aforementioned services and programs, the City of Lansing shall pay a total of \$26,927.00 payable in quarterly increments the first week of each quarter of calendar year 2017.

Either party may terminate this agreement by 60 days written notice to the other party.

The undersigned representative of the Leavenworth City Commission and Lansing City Council do hereby jointly agree to the conditions of this contract and will abide by the same.
