#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

**Approval of Minutes:** Councilmember Studnicka moved to approve the regular meeting minutes of March 3, 2016, as presented. Councilmember Garvey seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

#### **COUNCIL CONSIDERATION OF AGENDA ITEMS:**

**Eisenhower Road, Memorandum of Understanding:** Councilmember Studnicka moved to approve the Memorandum of Understanding, as presented. Councilmember McNeill seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### REPORTS:

**City Attorney:** City Attorney had nothing to report. **City Engineer:** City Engineer had nothing to report.

City Administrator: Tim advised that there is a Legislative Forum on Saturday, March 19, 2016 at the Riverfront Community Center in Leavenworth for those interested in attending. The Boring results from the slope failure near Lansing Elementary School were provided in the City Administrator Report and a more formal and detailed explanation of the results will follow from Terracon in the near future. The culvert repair is about 90% complete and should finish up shortly. Public Works Director Jeff Rupp will be working with the City Engineer regarding inspecting culverts on arterial and collector streets each month, so the City is aware of any possible deteriorating culverts and can address those more proactively. Parks and Recreation Director Jason Crum is working on the topic of a water line to Kenneth Bernard Park for the March 31, 2016 Work Session. If anyone has any questions prior to the Work Session, please address them with Jason Crum, so he has time to prepare. We have received an email from KDOT in regards to proceeding with the redesign of DeSoto Road and that we're good to go, but we have not yet received a supplemental agreement or formal contract. We will hopefully receive formal documentation in a few weeks and will present that to the Council at that time.

**Governing Body:** Councilmember Garvey thanked staff for providing the numbers on the de-icing salt and asked since we had such a mild winter if we would be spending the same amount for next year, as 2/3rds of the budget for de-icing salt was used. He wished everyone a Happy St. Patrick's Day, and announced that there are 7 months and 21 days until the November elections.

Councilmember McNeill asked if we would be receiving a report in layman's terms on what the boring results mean, the report provided is just grading and numbers and doesn't explain why the failure occurred or how to fix it.

Public Works Director Jeff Rupp replied that a formal report with further detail and explanation of the results
was received last minute and will be provided to Council once he has reviewed it with the City Engineer and
City Administrator, but it will be in layman's terms and provide more detail as to the why of the failure and
recommendations for resolution.

Councilmember Studnicka congratulated staff for their hard work, as he had two business men stop him and compliment us on managing the City of Lansing.

Councilmember Pawlowski asked when the 7 Mile Creek Project will be complete and if the City will begin the 9 Mile Creek Project to the 7 Mile Project being fully completed.

- City Administrator Tim Vandall replied that a formal date for completion has not been supplied, but we do not
  anticipate beginning the 9 Mile Creek Project until the 7 Mile Project is fully completed. Linaweaver has also
  brought on an additional crew to ensure the portion of the Park they are working on is completed before sports
  season starts.
  - Mayor Kirby stated last time I spoke to Tony he said they were on schedule.



Dear Sir:

We are writing to express our regard for two of the officers in your department--Michael Heuer and Trevor Osen.

This is a somehat belated letter, but we wanted you to know of our gratitude to these two officers.

We are in our 80s, living in a duplex, one in A; one in B. Going home after breakfast, from B to A, through our somewhat dark garages, we discovered an animal in one of the garages. We had visions of the long-toothed groundhog we had seen in the yard before. We called the police. The above two officers came, equipped to deal with whatever. It turned out to be a cat, in the garage all night, with nary a sound out of it. We felt like fools, but your men were very understanding.

Another call was for our mailboxes that had been knocked down by a car. We thought vandalism perhaps because no one admitted doing it to us. We called the police. That turned out to be an accident due to slippery road conditions. But your officers waded into the slushy snow to retrieve our mail that was scattered throughout the yard.

The last call was for a barking dog in the yard behind us. The poor dog barked almost nonstop night and day. It was hot weather. We never saw people there. We felt the dog desperately needed help. We called the police. This time just Officer Osen came. He tried to go into the dog's yard, but the dog ran at him. I think he then called the Humane Society. I only know the problem was resolved, and the dog lives there still and never barks. Someone is now taking care of him.

Officer Heuer received an award and his photo was in the paper. We sent him a congratulation card. Later, we were in front of our house changing a light bulb. He stopped long enough to thank us. He said he had seen our light was out and wondered if we were okay. We thought it was good that he observed and cared.

We lived in Leavenworth more than 50 years. Between us, we only called the police once. We have been in Lansing about 8 years now. We hope all our problems have been taken care of. But if not, we feel that your department, and especially Officers Heuer and Osen, are ready to respond.
